

City of Anna Staff's Weekly Highlights March 28 – April 1

Growing the Anna Economy

- Economic Development staff met with Cooksey Communications to discuss BRED Sponsorship, Director Real Estate Blog, and Red Productions video shoot.
- EDC sponsored the D CEO Commercial Real Estate Awards Ceremony with the Mayor presenting awards.
- Staff and CDC/EDC Board members attended the ICSC Red River Conference and networked with over 200 individuals.
- Staff finalized the April 7 EDC/CDC Meeting Agenda.



Sustainable Anna Community Through Planned Managed Growth

- Hurricane Creek Temporary Force Main: 6000'+ of force main has been installed. 200' bore has been completed. MH connection completed. Pumps were installed and awaiting on one additional coupling. Electrical lift station pumps are still on schedule to be on site May 25.
- **Utilities Division:**
 - Service Order Techs completed 890 work orders in March;
 - Completed 63 new meter installs;
 - Set 2 new fire hydrant meters;
 - Completed 14 sewer camera inspections, 1 failed;
 - Hauled 125,000 gallons of sewer from Hurricane Creek;
 - Installed SCADA antenna on Sherley EST;
 - WWTP was inspected by TCEQ, we asked what he would grade our inspection, he stated A-;
 - Coordinated with NTMWD and GTUA for chlorine maintenance period;
 - Rebuild chlorine regulator at Powell Pump Station;
 - Flushed water mains;
 - Repaired angle stop at 311 Winding Creek;
 - Repaired FH at PW facility;
 - Painted 28 fire hydrants.

- **Streets Division:**
 - Inspected drainages before and after storms;
 - Repaired 17 street name signs;
 - Repaired speed limit sign on Finley Blvd;
 - Repaired street light at Mitchell and Charleston;
 - Prepped PW parking lot for concrete;
 - Completed street patch at CR286 W. White St.;
 - Removed tree limbs from CR937 & CR287, and CR370;
 - Filled pot holes on Hackberry, James, Riggins, CR418, Highland, W. Foster Crossing, CR286, CR422, CR371, CR376; and
 - Picked up trash on SH5, CR426, CR268, and CR425.
- **Engineering & Construction Division:**
 - Issued review comments for an engineering plan resubmittal for East Foster Crossing Apartments;
 - Issued review comments for an engineering plan resubmittal for Coyote Meadows Phase 1A;
 - Reviewed and engineering plan submittal for the Anna Villas Retaining Walls;
 - Held a meeting with Anna ISD and TxDOT to discuss TxDOT's review comments for the FM 2862 driveway permit for Sherley Elementary School;
 - Met with engineer and developer to discuss a project along Persimmon Drive;
 - Met with engineer and developer to discuss future sanitary sewer for a project located in the ETJ;
 - Held a staff training session for inspectors to discuss the differences in PVC and Fiber Glass pipe installation;
 - Held a preconstruction meetings for the Anna Middle School Addition and Clements Creek Middle School;
 - Met with contractor setting up furniture in new City Hall Building;
 - Held an early grading preconstruction meeting for Lamar Bank;
 - Requested quotes from fence building contractors for a fence in the Foster Crossing Road project;
 - Issued a final acceptance for the QT Quick Trip project;
 - Met with Fire Chief to discuss a few fire related items at the new City Hall Building; and
 - Completed a total of 35 ROW Inspections with 6 failed inspections.

Anna – A Great Place to Live

- The Parks Crew sprayed post emergent and pre-emergent on all medians, at the Inc. Cube, and at the Public Works building.
- The Parks Crew painted the surface and all spray poles at the Slayter Creek Park Splash Pad.
- The Parks Crew sod cut and repaired ballfield lips at Slayter Creek Park. The Parks Crew prepped and chalked all game fields for the first week of games.
- The Park Superintendent worked with dynamic disc to complete the redesign and all signage of the disc golf course at Slayter Creek Park.
- The Park Superintendent met with contractor to correct drainage problems at Slayter Creek Park.

- Code Compliance responded to 34 new cases, 110 re-inspections, and closed 32 cases. Code Compliance has maintained its determination to keep Anna's right of ways clear and clean of trash and illegal bandit signs. This week officers removed four signs from the right of way. This week seven food establishments have been inspected.

High Performing, Professional City

- Patrol officers responded to 299 calls for service and conducted 249 traffic stops. Officers made four felony arrests and three misdemeanor arrests. The Patrol Division also investigated seven minor accidents.
- The Criminal Investigations Division filed one misdemeanor case and three felony cases with the Collin County District Attorney's Office. Detectives continued to actively investigate several open criminal cases.
- The Fire Operations Division responded to 73 calls for service from March 19 – April 1, 2022. The Division provided five mutual aid responses and received one mutual aid response.
- A barn located outside the city limits was destroyed by a fire on Friday, March 25. The Collin County Fire Marshal's Office, who has jurisdiction, is investigating the cause of the fire.
- Medic 2 was picked up this Friday from Frazer in Houston by Chief Wood and Chief Brown. It is now home and being made ready to enter service.
- The Collin County Fire Marshal held a meeting with Chief Isom and the Celina Fire Chief to discuss future Fire/EMS service delivery within the current county fire districts.
- Utility Billing coordinated 68 cutoffs with Public Works.
- The Finance Director and IT Director collaborated on issuing a Request for Proposal for a new Hosted VoIP Telephone System.
- Accounting staff continued to provide information for the FY 2021 audit.
