

## **City of Anna Staff's Weekly Highlights**

### **June 6 – June 10**

#### **Growing the Anna Economy**

- Sponsored Annual Greater Anna Chamber of Commerce Golf Tournament
- Assistant Director attended Texas City Management Association's Annual Conference and received the Assistant of the Year Award
- Conducted Joint City Council and CDC/EDC Board meeting
- Director met with 4 development groups and one industrial prospect

#### **Sustainable Anna Community Through Planned Managed Growth**

- Building Division received 8 new single family permit submittals and issued 1 new single-family permits.
  - The current fiscal year total is 874 single-family permits received.
- Public Works Director presented proposed impact fee revisions to the Planning & Zoning Commission, who unanimously recommended approval.
- Staff held a developer/neighbor round table to discuss Anna Town Square traffic
- Met with Anthony Lewis and walked City Hall to review remaining project needs.
- Collin Pump Station – The ground storage tank has been disinfected. GTUA delivery vault is being repaired, and they will inspect it once it has electrical service. Once ONCOR restores power we will move forward with testing the pumps.
- Hurricane Creek Temporary Lift Station – All equipment arrived this week. Installation scheduled.
- Street Division
  - Partnered with the City of Melissa to make repairs on County Road 417
  - Set up school zone flashers for the upcoming school year
  - Trimmed trees away from road:
    - S Easton St
    - E 6th St at 305 E 6th St
    - Wortham Dr at 212 Wortham St
    - 2nd St at 113 2nd St
    - W Hackberry Dr
    - East of HWY 5 at 112 Hackberry Dr
    - 218 E 4th St
  - Saw cut 2 panels, removed panels, set forms, expansion boards, rebar, chairs, and backfilled sidewalk in between 120 and 116 Hilltop Dr.
  - Drilled and tied rebar into new driveways and set chairs at 132 and 120 Hilltop Dr
  - Trimmed trees, and mowed overgrown grass along County Road 418, 417, 419, 368, and S Ferguson Pkwy
  - Pulled forms for 3 sidewalk panels and backfilled at 2009 Tanur Cascade
  - Poured concrete, edged, lined, and broomed driveway patch at 1113 Annie Oakley
  - Pulled forms, backfilled, and picked up barricades at curb and street repair site at W. Foster Crossing Blvd. and Arbor Ln.

- Poured concrete, floated, edged, lined, and broomed 3 sidewalk panels at 2009 Tanur Cascade. The job site was coned off when completed

    - Max May Production 3.688 MGD (18" water leak caused this to be higher)

  - Replaced tires on one Department Unit
  - Serviced brake and steering assist system on one Fire Department Unit
  - Coordinate registration for various vehicles
  - Replace batteries on Police Department Units 1801 and 1902
  - Oil change on Code Enforcement Units 560-102 and 560-101
- Engineering & Construction
  - Reviewed the product submittals for Hurricane Creek Sewer Line B
  - Completed a total of 28 ROW Inspections
  - Held interviews for Construction Inspector position
- Facilities division coordinated water damage remediation at the INC Cube
- On-boarded summer GIS intern, who will be assisting with utility map updates through mid-August
- GIS coordinated with Kimley-Horn to transfer utility GIS data to the city's ArcGIS organizational account

- Monday, June 6th Neighborhood Engagement sponsored a virtual gardening education class through Rooted-In. The class was titled Native Plant Design: Blending Beauty and Function. - Recreation Manager met with the Pecan Grove HOA Social committee to discuss the July Movie in the Park
- Recreation Manager conducted the Local Municipality Networking meeting in Celina with staff from Van Alstyne, Howe, Princeton and Celina.
- Secured Texas Parks and Wildlife Departments archery trailer for upcoming programs and tournaments and events.
- Thursday, June 9th Music in the Park featured Emerald City, 7 food vendors and approximately 500 neighbors were in attendance

- Hosted Senior Luncheon to discussed upcoming park projects, recreation programs and survey on feedback and future programming opportunities.
- Kicked off the summer adult softball league with 12 teams on Tuesday and 6 teams on Wednesday
- Code Compliance Department conducted 55 re-inspections and closed 19 open cases.
- Removed 5 signs from the public right of way
- Conducted 8 Health inspections on Food Trucks/Trailers

### High Performing, Professional City

- Patrol officers responded to 344 calls for service and conducted 223 traffic stops.
  - Officers made two felony arrests and two misdemeanor arrests.
  - Patrol investigated one minor and one major accident.
- The Criminal Investigations Division filed nine misdemeanor cases and six felonies with the Collin County District Attorney’s Office.
- Chief Habel spoke on growth trends and departmental impacts at the Hurricane Creek Rotary Club meeting this week.
- The Fire Operations Division responded to 38 calls for service, provided 1 mutual aid response and received 1 mutual aid response.
- Passed on-site inspection with the Texas Department of State Health Services which will allow the Fire Department to provide ambulance service
- Andres Salinas (right) received his Paramedic certification after 1305 hours of instruction and passing the state test
- Hired TCFP/TDSHS certified Firefighter/EMT Nick Moser-Hooten (below)
  - The Garland native graduated from Richland Collegiate High School before graduating Cum Laude from West Texas A&M University with a bachelor’s degree in emergency management administration. Nick will begin paramedic training this fall



- Staff participated in a city-wide mandatory anti-harassment training on June 7th and June 8<sup>th</sup> hosted by the Human Resources Department.
- The Human Resources Department selected staff nominees to participate in the upcoming Supervisor Toolkit and the Professional Development training series.
- The Human Resources Department hosted first “Next Big Thing” quarterly City-wide meeting via MS Teams to boost employee engagement and demonstrate employee appreciation and recognition.
- The Human Resources Department created internal benefits webpage to allow employees easy access to benefits information, tools, and resources.
- Interviews were held for the Senior Accountant position. An offer was extended and accepted.
