Growing the Anna Economy

- The Economic Director attended the International Economic Development Council (IEDC) Annual Conference in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.
- The Anna EDC sponsored Bisnow's Collin County State of the Market Expo held in McKinney and presented EDC's new marketing video to 250+ attendees.
- The Assistant Director presented to Leadership Anna and discussed Economic Development.
- The Director gave a presentation at the Neighbor Academy session on Economic Development.
- Economic Development staff met with 15 developers.

Sustainable Anna Community Through Planned Managed Growth

- This week (Friday, September 16 – Thursday, September 22) the Building Division received 1 new single family permit submittals and issued 2 new single-family permits. The current fiscal year total is 1,051 single-family permits received.
- Collin Pump Station: Cleared areas for drill rig, widened driveway for rig and trailers.
- Hurricane Creek Temporary Lift Station: Installed, running on generator power. GCEC is building the transformers and will be ready soon to hook up permanent power.
- Mechanical Bar Screen Replacement at WWTP: Survey and design complete. The manufacturing process is ongoing.
- Backup generator connections: Scheduled for October installation.
- **Streets Division:**
 - Continued to work with AISD on school zones (Striping bars for Harlow in ATS);
 - Talk with neighborhood services about Public Works Week event;
 - Ordered new parts for school zone lights/signs (inventory);
 - Worked with AISD on traffic using an unopen road near the high school;



- Completed a total of 65 ROW Inspections with 15 failed inspections. Failures were due to damaged sidewalks and meter boxes silted in; and
- Completed a total of 19 Flatwork Inspections with 4 failed inspections. Failures were due to flatwork not being set up correctly and broken sewer cleanouts.

Anna – A Great Place to Live

- A public input workshop for the upcoming splash pad redevelopment was held during the Parks Advisory Board meeting on September 19.
- Marshall Lancaster completed surveys for the fitness court and the splash pad areas of Slayter Creek Park. The splash pad survey was forwarded to Kraftsman.
- The Recreation Division hosted our first Pop-up Recreation of the Fall Season on September 17. Sixteen people were in attendance for the magic show!
- The Recreation Coordinator attended the NRPA conference in Phoenix.

- The Recreation Division met with Trent Kelley and Chris Pearson, with Musco lighting, to discuss possible opportunities with Live Streaming the city's sport/outdoor recreation programs for the future as we grow.
- The Recreation Division met with SoCal sports to discuss adaptive opportunities for the community. They advised beginning with an adaptive basketball tournament. Once our basketball courts are up and ready, this will be an opportunity to kick off this tournament. The Recreation Coordinator will look into an adaptive local non-profit or charity to partner with, A meeting was setup for October 4 with Lezley Hansen to discuss Adaptive Recreation Programming.
- The Recreation Division hosted its first Senior Foodie Troop lunch at Crow's Café on September 20 and there were seven seniors in attendance.
- On Monday, September 19, the Recreation Division hosted the final Annafest logistics planning meeting that included personnel from Public Works, Fire, Police, and Communications.
- The Recreation Division has been working with the Communications Manager to finalize all branding and promotion efforts for Annafest.
- The Recreation Division has been working on finalizing all aspects of Annafest including vendor confirmations and payments and supply ordering.
- The Park's Crew mowed Slayter Park, Pecan Groove, Geer Park, Natural Springs Park, and the Municipal Complex.
- The Park's Crew post emerged Oak Hollow, Johnson Park ballfield and entrance sign, the Municipal Complex landscape beds/ tree rings, and Slayter Park landscape beds.
- The Park Superintendent attended NRPA conference in Pheonix.
- The Parks Crew prepped and chalked ballfields for adult softball games.
- The Code Compliance Division of CEC (Community Enhancement and Compliance) created 69 new Code Compliance cases this week. The team re-inspected 140 cases and closed 114 as complied by owner. In addition, officers also removed 56 signs from the public right of way. A chart is provided showing this week's top five violations for the City of Anna.
- Code Compliance conducted 10 health services inspections of the local food establishments and grocery stores. - The Community Enhancement Coordinator hosted fall sweep this week. Six groups participated. The group that collects the most trash will be awarded a price next week.
- The Community Enhancement Coordinator has passed out 20 bales of hay to community and staff for the 2022 scarecrow contest to be displayed at AnnaFest.
- Neighborhood Services and CEC staff participated in fall sweep by picking up litter at Natural Springs Park.



- The Community Enhancement Coordinator presented to the Ministerial Alliance on the volunteer programs the city has to offer. We look forward to continued collaboration.

High Performing, Professional City

- During this past week, patrol officers responded to 374 calls for service and conducted 188 traffic stops. Officers made one felony arrest and five misdemeanor arrest. Officers investigated two minor accidents and two major accidents.
- The Criminal Investigations Division filed five misdemeanor cases and thirteen felony cases. Detectives also filed three cases with the Collin County Grand Jury. Detectives continued to actively investigate several open criminal cases.
- Anna Fire Rescue, for the week of September 17 - 23, responded to 39 calls for service; 28 of those calls were EMS related and Fire Rescue transported 17 individuals to area hospitals. Fire Rescue provided five mutual aid responses and received 4 mutual aid responses.
- Assistant Fire Chief Dan Wood, spoke at the HOA and Community Leadership Meeting on Monday about updates on fire services. This group meeting is organized by the Community Enhancement and Compliance Division.
- Fire Chief Ray Isom spoke at the noon Rotary Club meeting on Thursday that was held at the Fire Station in The Ashmore Room. Chief Ray Isom spoke about fire services and programs and then members toured the station.

- Every Month Baylor Scott and White McKinney holds an EMS Partnership Meeting with all area EMS providers, to discuss different EMS topics related to real events that happened from the month before. This month's topic for discussion was treatment and transport of patients suffering from a Stroke or CVA. Along with the topic of discussion, the hospital picks a EMS report related to that topic. The EMS report chosen for this month is a 911 response by Anna Fire Rescue. Our members were requested to attend this meeting to receive a Stroke Service Award from Baylor Scott and White Hospital.



The award is given based on excellent care, documentation, and response times to the scene and the hospital. The Hospital EMS Program Manager indicated that she had never seen an EMS report with the details of care and treatments including patient demographics that allowed the hospital to reach family members quickly to inform them of the patient's conditions. Anna Fire Rescue's B-Shift was presented this award on Friday, September 23.
